**ADMISSION:** The Gardens at the Springs Preserve, the Trails and the Children's Play area are free with a suggested donation; however, a ticket is required for admittance. No tickets are needed to access the gift shop, library and the Springs Cafe. There is a charge for entrance into the Origen Museum and Desert Living Center. Tickets may be purchased the day of visit or in advance at the ticketing window or on-line at [springspreserve.org](http://springspreserve.org). General admission does not include admission to select events, concerts, performances, or classes.

**AMENITIES:** **Guest Services** – Learn about what's happening the day of your visit from Preserve staff, pick up site maps, literature about upcoming events and educational classes. Rent strollers and lockers or obtain a wheelchair.

**Springs Cafe by Wolfgang Puck** – With seating capacity of approximately 200, the Springs Preserve Cafe by Wolfgang Puck offers casual dining indoors or al fresco with a view of the Las Vegas Strip. The Cafe is open from 11 a.m. – 3 p.m. daily with extended hours and custom menus for special events.

**Springs Preserve Gift Shop and Library** – Cultural and educational gifts, books and souvenirs are available for purchase in the Gift Shop. The Springs Preserve Library is an affiliate of the Las Vegas-Clark County Library District and it is non-circulating. Visitors are welcome to peruse the collection's hundreds of books and audiovisual materials at workstations and/or reading tables. Library topics include Mojave Desert ecology, sustainable architecture, wildlife, archaeology, history of the Southwest, nonprofit management and museum studies. The Gift Shop and Library are open from 10 a.m. – 6 p.m. daily with extended hours for special events.
