David "Red Boy" Schildt

Cowboy Poet, Singer, Songwriter, Rodeo Rider

A member of the Pikuni-Blackfeet tribe, Schildt was born in Texas – like his great-grandfather before him – and raised in Montana on the Blackfeet Indian Reservation. He has competed in rodeo as a bull and bronco rider for more than 20 years, including competition at the Indian National Finals Rodeo. He has recorded and produced an album, worked in Los Angeles as a film stuntman and actor, performed at the National Cowboy Poetry Gathering in Elko, Nev. and at the Buffalo Bill Historical Center in Cody, Wyo. His performances have taken him to the Smithsonian, Silver City, N.M., Seattle's NW Folklife Festival, South Dakota, Palm Springs, Calif. and the stage of the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville. Schildt has settled down some, working for the Walker River Paiute Tribe in Schurz, Nev., focusing on fish and game laws.
